- Once said: "I would rather be ashes than dust! I would rather that my spark burn out in a brilliant glaze than it should be stifled by dry rot. I would rather be a superb meteor; every atom of me in magnificent glow, than a sleepy permanent planet. The proper function of a man is to live, not to exist."
