3:6a Project: Instructional Video



The objective of this project is to create a video that instructs the audience how to do something. The instructional level should fit your target audience. If in doubt about the level, assume the audience knows little or nothing about the topic. Concrete, objective tasks work better than abstract, subjective topics. The video should have a beginning, middle, and an end. As with news stories, the beginning should set the tone of the production. The middle will contain the information or "how-to's". The end or conclusion summarizes the program and gives the audience a sense of closure.

- The finished project will be between 5 to 10 minutes.
- Choose a topic and get teacher approval
- Rough draft a list of steps needed to accomplish the task
- Script and Storyboard the idea •
- Shoot the raw footage •
 - Remember to shoot cutaways to avoid jump cuts!
 - Shoot same scene from different angles for variety!
- Tape the narration
- Edit
 - o music should be added
 - o graphics should be used within the video and should include:
 - o title, instructive graphic overlays, and alphabetized credits
- Begin with a countdown, then a 5 second black leader and end with a 5 second black tag.
- Length of time for completion
- 150 Total possible points
